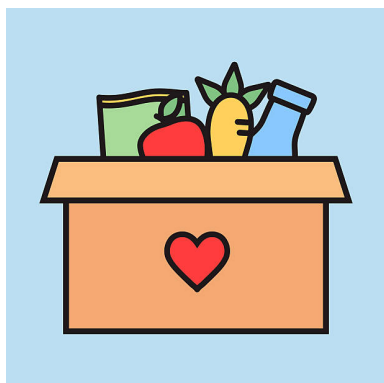

Are you interested in learning more about our Blessing Box Ministry? Refer to the FAQ below!

1. What is the Blessing Box?

The Blessing Box is a Little Free Library style box mounted outside the front door of the church by the sidewalk. It started as an Eagle Project for one of our scouts, but has morphed into so much more! We currently provide meal kits, to-go snacks, canned foods, hygiene products, and some clothing.

2. Who does the Blessing Box help?

The Blessing Box is primarily designed for two groups of people: the homeless population, and low-income housed people. Our Meal Kits are intended for the latter, while most clothing/hygiene products are intended for the former (although they are available for everyone).

3. How can I help?

The best way you can support this ministry is by donating items! Currently, we especially need **feminine hygiene products** and **boxed mac-and-cheese**, but any shelf-stable food items/hygiene products are welcome! For more ideas, check the handouts in the



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back of the church or ask Elizabeth. Donations can be placed in the little red wagon in the back of the church.
